Morocco | Day by day

Day 1: Wednesday Arrival in Tangier and visit to the city. Overnight in Tangier.

Day 2: Tangier/Chefchaouen / Tangier – Thursday

Breakfast at the hotel. Travel to Chefchaouen. Lunch at a restaurant. Visit to the Medina and the Jewish Quarter: The structure of the Medina reflects Arab-Berber-Jewish coexistence, where the color blue was introduced by Jewish communities, becoming the essence of the city. The houses and streets painted in blue, especially in the oldest areas of the Medina, represent the Hebrew tradition of painting to evoke the sky and God. In Tangier visit Synagogue Shaar Rafael and American Consulate. Dinner and overnight in Tangier.

Day 3: Tangier/Arzila/Rabat - Friday

Start your day with breakfast at the hotel. Journey to Arzila where you can visit the Jewish quarter, then the journey continues to Rabat. Drive to Morocco's capital city. Check-in in the Hotel. Explore Hassan Tower: Visit this iconic landmark, a symbol of Rabat's rich history. Overnight Rabat.

Day 4: Rabat - Saturday

Start your day with breakfast at the hotel. Saturday and Shabbat Services: Attend morning services at synagogue Rabbi Shalom Zaoui near Bab Mellah. Visit Mellah of Rabat: The former Jewish quarter, located in the medina, with narrow streets and typical architecture, where Jews lived and traded. 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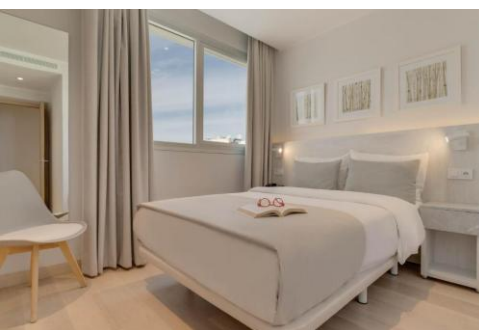

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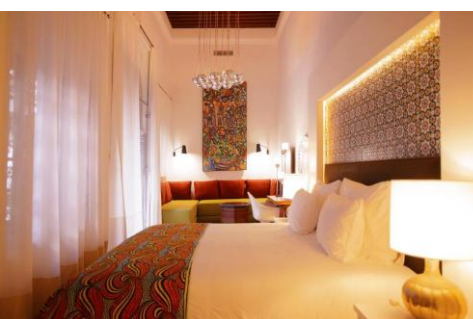

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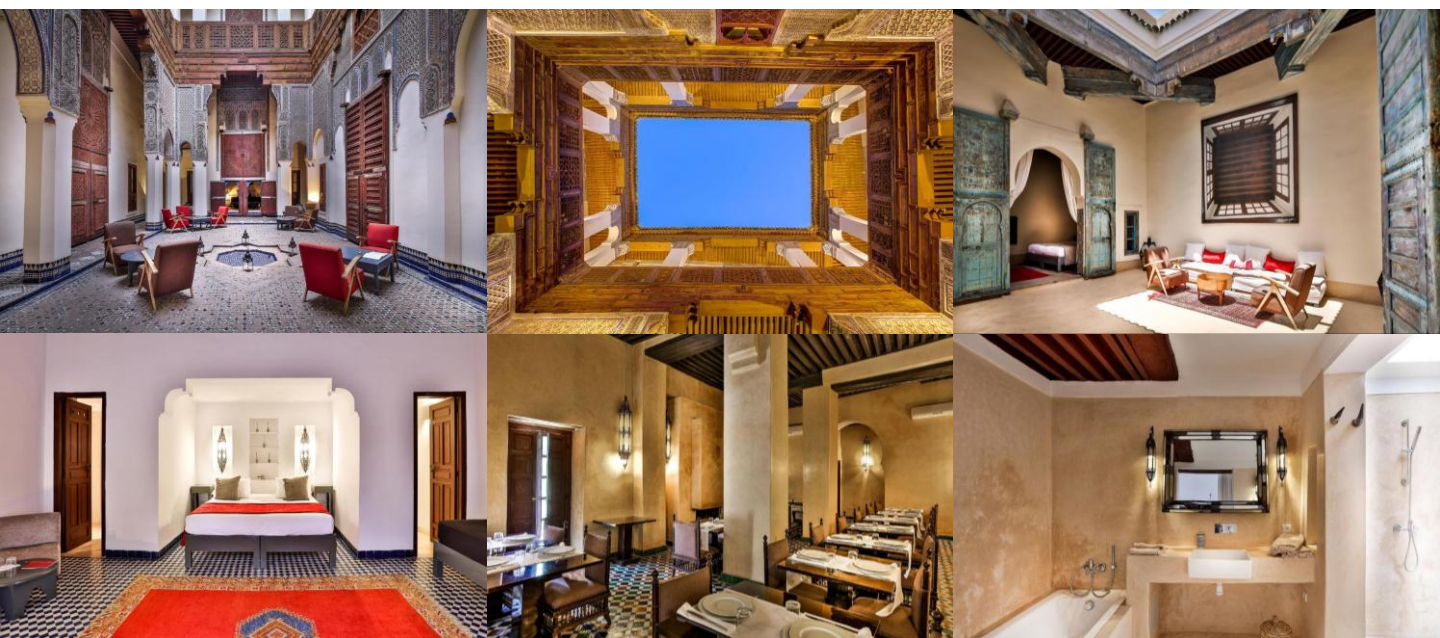
Fez – Riad Dar Bensouda 4*

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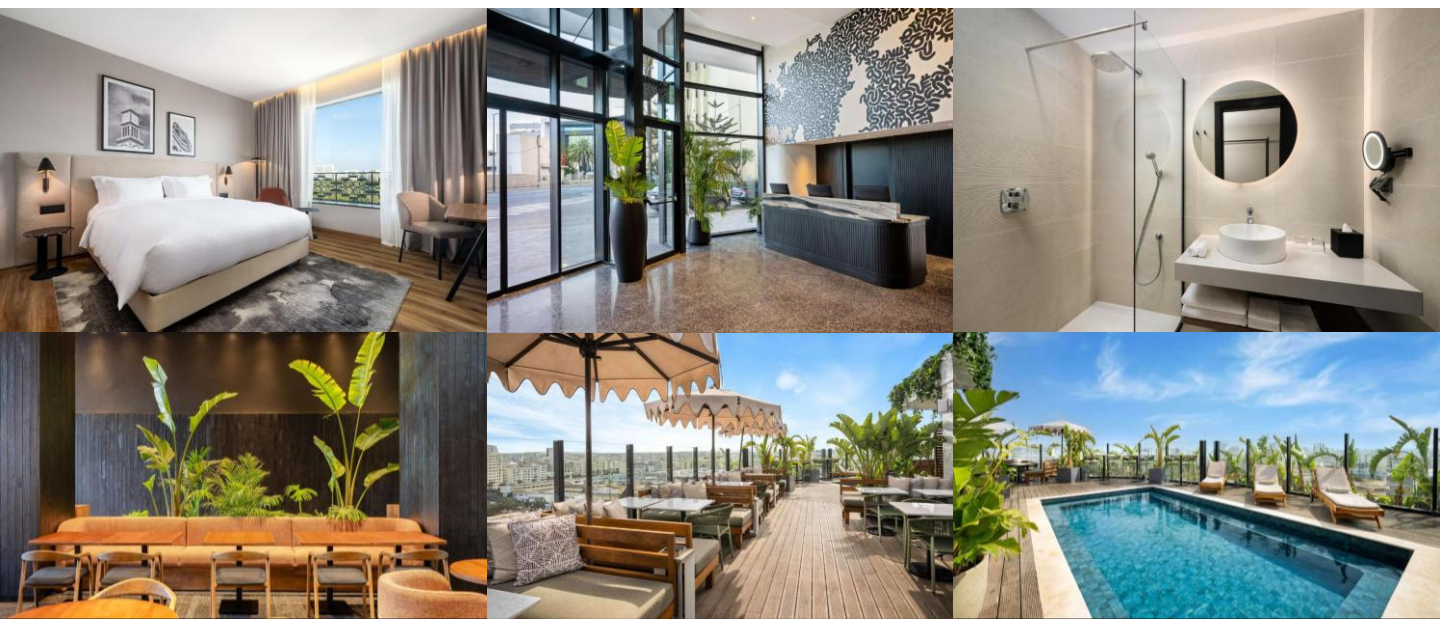

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the airport of Marrakech.

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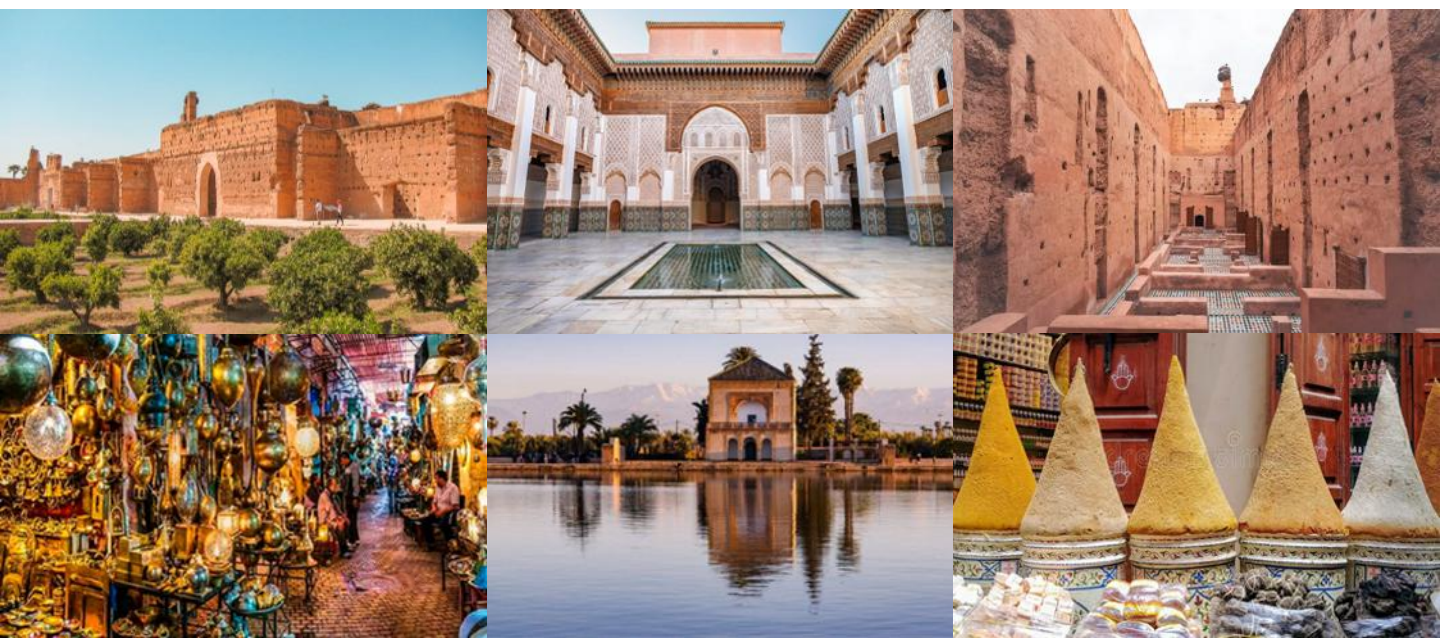
Marrakech - Destination

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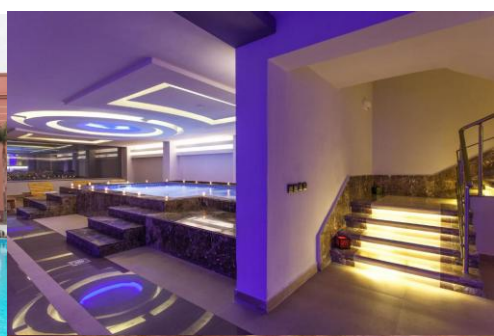
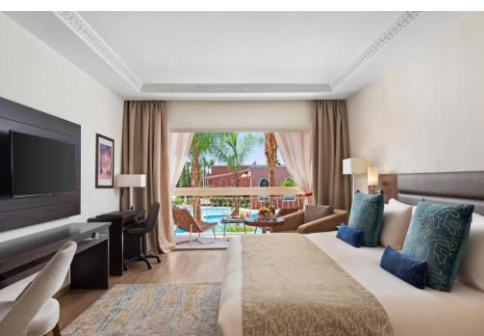
